Accommodation Options

Homestays

Homestay can generally be found in a reasonable travelling distance from the campus. Homestays offer a safe, caring environment in which to study while you become immersed in the Australian way of life. Homestays cost around A\$200–220 per week, paid to the Homestay host. Living in Homestays is a good way to know more about Australia culture and lifestyle.

Private Apartments

Private Apartments can be found easily especially in the CBD area. Please note that private apartments are not an option for students who are under 18 years of age and it is also not possible toarrange private share accommodation in advance. It is therefore best to arrive one to two weeks in advance before classes begin to inspect apartments.

Generaly real estate agent requires one month rent in advance plus a refundable security deposit (bond). You will be responsible for your share of rent for the time of your lease, which is normally 12 months. Most of the private apartment is unfurnisured. It is therefore important to allow for establishment costs including purchase of furniture and equipments. The costs of electricity, gas and telephone are additional.

Student Hotels

Each hostel is within walking distance or a short tram ride to the Collins Street campus. Most hostels provide meals so cooking skills are not needed. Facilities vary from hostel to hostel. Places are limited so early application is advisable.
